6 NIGHTS/7 DAYS (APRIL 18 - 24, 2010)

Day one: Quito

Upon your evening arrival at Quito Airport, you will be met by your escort and transferred to the beautiful San Jorge Eco-Lodge & Botanical Reserve, which will be your primary base. (No meals included.)

Day Two: Tandayapa Cloud Forest

Enjoy the day mountain biking along Nono-Tandayapa, a famous birdwatchers route. While descending from the virgin cloud forest, pass through the Sierra (an enormous canyon) and Tandayapa and Pichincha's untouched foothills. This easy, downhill tour of the cloud forest (approx. 55 km) offers picturesque sightseeing opportunities. (For those who do not wish to bike ride, a transfer will be offered to San Jorge de Tandayapa to meet the group for lunch.) Overnight San Jorge/ Tandayapa (B, L, D)

Day Three: San Jorge de Tandayapa Hummingbird Sanctuary

Experience firsthand the beautiful San Jorge de Tandayapa Hummingbird Reserve (tropical cloud forest) on a nature hiking expedition. Take in panoramic views, tropical plants and flowers, and exotic birds and wild-

life. Enjoy lunch at San Jorge's open aired Hummingbird Restaurant. Later enjoy "Wild Voices: Night Walk in the Cloud Forest". Overnight San Jorge/Tandayapa (B, L, D)

Day Four: San Jorge de Milpe Orchid & Bird Reserve

Hike along lush jungle trails through San Jorge Milpe Orchid and Bird Reserve (surrounding Pichincha Mountain) and swim below the area's majestic waterfalls. This paradise boasts nearly 450 bird species and 300 varieties of orchids. At the end of the day, enjoy "Wild Voices – Night Walk in the Tropical Rainforest" where you will hear the songs of saturnines, owls, parakeets, and frogs. Overnight San Jorge/Milpe (B, L, D)

Day Five: San Jorge Botanical Reserve

Hike to the Highland Tropical Rainforest, visiting up to 5 sacred waterfalls and learning about some of the region's 250 varieties of native medicinal plants. Take in the breathtaking panoramic views of Quito, its lush valleys and majestic mountains and the volcano peaks of Cayambe, Antizana, Pasochoa, Pululahua, Pichincha, and Illalo. Overnight San Jorge/Quito (B, L, D)

Day Six: Central Andes Chain and Papallacta Natural Hot Springs

Journey through the High Andes Barren Plains on the same route Francisco De Orellana walked when he discovered the Amazon River. Travel through the Tumbaco, Cumbaya and Pifo Valleys and end at Papallacta Lake where you can relax in the natural hot springs. The guided trip will highlight the botanical and ecological history of the Coca Cayambe Ecological Reserve, home to the spectacular condor. Overnight San Jorge/Quito (B, bL, D)

Day Seven: Quito

Following breakfast, you will be transferred to the Quito Airport to begin your journey home.

Optional 1-Day Trip Extension: Old Colonial Quito City Tour (additional fee applies)

Enjoy a private tour of Ecuador's capital, considered part of the Cultural Patrimony of Humanity by UNESCO. Explore the Baroque colonial art, history, archaeology and folklore of the city. Includes: Plaza de la Independencia, Plaza San Francisco, Plaza Santo Domingo, La Merced, La Compania, Penecillo. Overnight at San Jorge/Quito (B, L, D). The next morning, you will be transferred to Quito Airport. (B)
